

## **Summer Job Checklist for Teens and Parents**

Use this checklist to ensure you're prepared for your summer job and understand your tax responsibilities. Check off each item as you complete it!

#### **Before Starting the Job**

- [] **Research the Job**: Understand the job duties, hours, and pay rate.
- [] Gather Necessary Documents: Have your Social Security number, identification (e.g., driver's license or school ID), and any work permits if required.

## On the First Day

- [] Fill Out Form W-4:
  - [] Provide accurate information to determine the correct amount of federal income tax to withhold from your paycheck.
  - o [] Use the IRS Withholding Calculator to help fill out the form accurately.
- [] Complete State Tax Forms: If applicable, fill out any state-specific tax withholding forms.

- [] Collect Final Paycheck: Ensure you receive your final paycheck and that it includes all hours worked and any remaining tips.
- [] **Request a W-2 Form**: Your employer should provide a W-2 form by January 31 of the following year, summarizing your earnings and withholdings.

## **Tax Filing Season**

- [] **Gather Documents**: Collect your W-2 form(s) and any other tax documents (e.g., 1099 forms for self-employment income).
- [] File Your Tax Return: Contact your tax practitioner to file your tax return accurately.
